The school's enrollment is currently 270 students, grades K4-12, including international students from Europe and Asia with capacity for 32 students in the school's International House. On September 1, 2020, Springwood celebrated its 50th year of college preparatory academic, fine arts, and athletic excellence.

ACCREDITATIONS AND MEMBERSHIPS

Springwood holds memberships in both the Alabama Independent School Association (AISA) and Georgia Independent School Association (GISA). Springwood School is also certified by the Student Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) which allows Springwood to issue Form I-20 to international students so they can apply for an F-1 visa to enter the United States. The school's programs are open to qualified students of all races, creeds, and ethnic origins.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Springwood School is committed to serve the community by requiring each graduate to complete 100 hours of community service over his/her four years of high school. These hours can be served at any non-profit organization as well as through the school's many service clubs.



CO-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

There are many opportunities to be active within the school and broader community. Student Government Association, Leo Club, National Honor Society, Math Team, Scholars Bowl, Robotics Team, Thespian Society, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and Yearbook provide valuable learning experiences outside the classroom.

Interim Experience: Three days of travel, job shadowing for seniors, community service, and field trips during March instead of traditional classes

Internship: Opportunity for juniors and seniors to work in a field of interest while earning class credit

Wildcat Workday: Annual school-wide day of service when students and faculty work throughout the community



ADMISSIONS

Springwood School has a selective screening process for all applicants. Potential students are required to provide transcripts for evaluation and assessment. Letters of reference and interviews are required in order for successful enrollment. Our average class size is 14 students with our high school enrollment at 130. For students in grades K4-8, IXL is used for math assessment testing and STAR for literacy assessment evaluations. The College and Career Counselor is an integral part of the assessment process.



FACILITIES

Our 46-acre campus houses seven buildings: primary, elementary, media center/junior high, high school, fine arts center, gymnasium and the international house. In addition, the school maintains a football and soccer stadium and baseball and softball complex.
